HOW TO PREPARE VEGETABLES FOR EXHIBITION

1. Choose well shaped vegetables. Groups to be of similar size.
2. Choose vegetables free from blemishes.
3. Cut off tops, leaving 1" where applicable.
4. Polish with a dry cloth. Cleanliness counts.
5. Choose medium sized onions. Bend tops over to stop growth, in order for them to mature. Pull and dry in the sun. Do not peel.
6. Choose medium sized carrots, beets and potatoes.
7. Leave stem on squash. Choose large squash.
8. Use appropriate sized plate.
